Food supply critically low at food bank

The Central Virginia Food Bank has reached a critical level of food availability. Food Bank leaders believe a number of factors have contributed to an increased demand for food, including the housing crisis, rising gas and utility costs, and unemployment in some parts of the Central Virginia region.

CVFB provides food for a large area including counties south to the North Carolina state line, east to the Northern Neck, and west to the Piedmont region.

CVFB seeks non-perishable, non-breakable food items used in healthy meals, including canned fruits and vegetables, canned meats and fish, and pasta. Food may be donated at the CVFB's Food Distribution Center, 1415 Rhoadmiller St., or at community collection boxes including the Carytown Ukrop's, six BB&T locations and six Midas locations around the region.
